### **Local Hearing to be held at Port Washington Water Pollution Control District headquarters for the proposed replacement of Sandy Hollow Road Siphon Lines**

The Board of Commissioners of the Port Washington Water Pollution Control District will hold a public hearing on Wednesday July 17, 2013 at 7:00 pm to discuss the capital financing required for the replacement of the aging Sandy Hollow Road Siphon Line System and the purchase and installation of replacement Emergency Generators at three pumping stations.

The existing 63 year old 12-inch and 14-inch Siphon Lines under Sandy Hollow Road will be disconnected and new 12-inch and 14-inch Siphon Lines will be installed under Francis Drive and Roger Drive.

The District will also seek financing for the purchase and installation of Emergency Generators at Pumping Stations "G", "K" and "O" to replace existing units which suffered undue wear and tear.

The total estimated cost for the above two projects will not exceed \$5,700,000 and the increase in capital assessment per household in the District is approximately \$2.14 per \$100 taxable valuation (\$32/yr for a house with a fair market value of \$600,000).
